Wales European Squash Masters Open 2016 – Age is but a number!

Over the weekend of 9th-11th December Cardiff welcomed 130 squash players from all over Europe for the Wales leg of the 2016 European Squash Federation's

With the large entry the tournament was dually hosted by Squash Wales at Sport Wales National Centre in Sophia Gardens and Cardiff Squash Rackets Club just a few hundred metres away, and with the official tournament hotel being The Angel, the set-up provided an excellent combination, right in the heart of Cardiff City Centre with its numerous visitor attractions and some



(ESF), European Masters Circuit. The first time the Wales Masters Open has been included on the European Circuit.

Masters Squash is for all players over the age of 35 with tournaments and competitions for both men and women in five year age categories from 35+, 40+, 45+....etc up to 75+. Many participants are ex full international squash players with a desire to continue a high level of competition after their earlier achievements, although many participants could also be late developers or players who took up the game later on in life. But all have one thing in common, and that is that they

superb Christmas shopping close at hand to compliment the Squash.

The weekend kicked off at mid-day Friday with some close encounters going on until late in the evening. After a quick shower, the 'just as important' social side got into swing with a buffet and for those who perhaps hadn't exerted too much energy during the day there was plenty of late night dancing to an excellent Welsh singer.

An early start Saturday for some, saw matches on court at 9am although one or two did need rousing by the organisers, forever looking at their watches with such a busy schedule to get

Player Interviews

Marko Kruse and Birgit Fichter interviewed by Alicja Kulp



In our October 2016 issue of the newsletter, we informed you that Marko Kruse and Birgit Fichter were top of the leader board in the number of tournaments they have played in; at that time Marko Kruse had played in all 18 tournaments over last 2 years and Birgit Fichter led the way with 12 tournaments in the ladies. I met up with them at the Belgian tournament and asked what motivated them!



I always have good matches and playing against a variety of players helps my game. Of course, it's a great way of socialising and meeting friends.

The circuit is expanding and now includes more cities, so I take the opportunity of visiting some of these cities. Next year, for example, I

look forward to going to Bordeaux and Helsinki.

I don't only play in the Masters Circuit, I also play in other opens such as Moscow and St Petersburg, and I hope to play in Odessa in the Ukraine It is incredible to see how many women play in these tournaments.

I enjoy all tournaments but the two which stand out for me are Oporto, having a city tour followed by evening dinner right next to the squash courts! It was a lovely setting and an enjoyable tournament; and Budapest - it's great when the organisers arrange a city tour.

My most memorable matches are against Monika Wesselkamp, Renata Nejtkova and Denisa Linhartova, such great opponents.

With more and more people playing, the days for playing are getting longer and longer. I would therefore ask the organisers to give us as much advance notice of matches as possible so that we can plan around our matches and I can get myself organized with transport and food.

Going forward, I look forward to playing as much as possible subject to work commitments and accessibility to locations.

I like the competitions and these tournaments are getting better and better with more tournaments in the circuit and with more and more players. There are new players every time. It started off with only 50 players, and now we see 100 players regularly every time, even when there were 2



tournaments in October this year with Poland and Belgium competing against each other.

With more tournaments, that gives people some flexibility as to which ones they want to play in.

Poland was really well organized, and of course Germany always stands out for me. Italy seems to lose out with the timing of this tournament, but it's always well organized.

I have made a lot of friends from many countries and, with English being the common language, my English is improving - I couldn't speak a word of English 2 years ago!

I plan to go to as many tournaments as I can, but it may be difficult as we all need rest and we're all getting older.

I think 4 matches is enough, 5 matches are a lot and sometimes we see injuries as a result. I personally prefer the Monrad System rather Groups, but I know it's difficult to please everyone and Alan does a great job in trying to make the best draws possible for everyone.



Tendering for Tournaments



One of the main tasks of the Masters Sub-Committee is the ongoing improvement and coordination of Masters Events. We have a commitment to everyone involved to reach a high standard of all tournaments offered as part of the Masters Circuit. We start this commitment by adopting a "Tendering Process" in the use of a registration form, known as the 'Tender'.

Associations Invited To Tender

Members of the National Associations, Tournament Directors and Organisers are invited to complete a



During the tournament the smooth running, the attendance of the participants and ongoing online information are key points in ensuring tournaments of the highest standards. That is why we try to define these details in advance in the tender document - details such as refereeing, updated results, audience capacities



(room behind the courts) or the balls used - small details in themselves but together offering a high quality for everyone involved – the organisers, the players and the supporters.

Tenders Are Evaluated

The tenders received are then checked and evaluated by us in a predefined process, the same for all countries offering to host a Masters Tournament. We can draw tournament directors' attention to missing

points and ask them to correct them. A post-tournament evaluation then provides a guide on its success and allows us to compare each tournament enabling identified improvements for the following year should organisers wish to host another tournament in the following year.

For full details on the form, please refer to the ESF site. Due dates for the next year are as follows:

1st January – Deadline to invite organisers to provide tender

1st March – Deadline for receipt of tender

1st May – Deadline for organisers to be informed if successful or not

1st June – Publication of tournaments for the following year

Ultimately, we focus on a very detailed and complete tendering process, to guarantee the participants a high standard before, during and after the tournaments.
